***BIO/DANCE and Social Justice***  
"BIO/DANCE AND SOCIAL JUSTICE" SERIES BEGINS MAY 29

Rochester, NY – BIODANCE begins its *BIO/DANCE and Social Justice* series later this month on May 29, 2015 with performances through the end of the year. Venues include Monroe Community Hospital, Community Place of Greater Rochester, Kinectons, Rush Rhees Library and more. The series was developed by BIODANCE's Artistic Director Missy Pfohl Smith, also the Director of the Program of Dance and Movement at University of Rochester, and is meant to provide a forum for choreographers and collaborative artists to create socially conscious work. Smith says, "Community engagement can take many forms. I see this series as a way to bring different communities of people together to experience art and dance, to listen to one another's perspectives and to engage in conversation. In my new choreography, *In/Difference*, I am thinking about how misunderstanding of difference serves as a divide and about how dangerous indifference can be in the world. Both the dance work and the series itself is meant to provide new exposure for different segments of the community to one another."

\*Performances are free and open to the public. The dances will reflect themes of social justice and equality.
